This creates all kinds of problems, both for teens and adults. Many kids find it difficult concentrating and

studying. Every few minutes, they pick up the phone to see if they have new notifications or messages.

Many specialists point out that this type of behavior can be classified as an addiction. And it affects everyone, regardless of age. Children imitate their parents, thus normalizing this behavior.

Here is a small list of some typical symptoms of **being hooked** on a cell phone:

You check it every two or three minutes. When you wake up, the first thing you do is looking at your cell phone, and the last thing when you go to sleep too.

The truth is that it's very common to check your phone just when you wake up. I like doing that. At night I prefer to read a bit.

You check your phone when you're with friends or family. It's sad, but in many family gatherings, we all check our cell phones at some point.

You eat while looking at your cell phone. If you are alone, you unlock your phone and start moving your finger vertically while disconnecting completely from real life.

If you leave your phone at home, it feels like it's the end of the world. And, you cannot know for sure if it's the end of the world because you can't check it on your phone.

After making this list, it seems to me that I'm a little bit **hooked**, but only a little bit :)

I have a friend who uses an old phone with no internet, no touch screen, and no modern phone features. He uses the phone to call and be located. At first, I thought he was crazy, but maybe he's not so mad after all.

Well, today we have seen a current issue that affects us in one way or another. Although sometimes being **hooked on something** can be beneficial. For

example, if you're hooked on my podcast, then it's great because your English is improving a lot.

No, not with the use of money. With the use of time. He was conscientious about the use of time.

With what?

With the use of time.

Jim was concerned about the time people spent on their cell phones.

Was Jim concerned about the weather?

No. Not the weather. He was concerned about the time people spent on their cell phones.

What did people spend their time with?

Cell phones. People spent time on their cell phones.

And who cared about that?

Jim. Jim was worried.

Jim developed a sophisticated mobile app. Did Jim develop a poor computer app?

No. Not a poor computer app. He developed a sophisticated mobile app.

What type of app was it?

Mobile. It was a mobile app. You can also say a cell phone instead of a mobile.

The app helped people to use their cell phones less.

What helped people to use their cell phones less?

The app. The app helped people to use their cell phones less.

Who did the app help?

People. The app helped people.

The app was so successful that everyone gradually stopped using the mobile.

Was the app successful?

Yes, it was successful. The app was successful.

Did everyone stop using computers?

No. Not computers. Everyone gradually stopped using their cell phones.

Gradually or suddenly?

Gradually. Suddenly means quickly and unexpectedly.

In the end, nobody needed the app, so Jim didn't sell a single one.

Did Jim sell any apps?

No, Jim didn't sell any.

Why didn't he sell?

Because nobody needed the app, that was the reason.

What didn't he sell?

The app. Jim didn't sell a single app.
