No, George and Peter didn't swim to Hawaii.

**Where did they want to swim last summer?**

To Hawaii. George and Peter wanted to swim to Hawaii.

**Why didn't George and Peter swim to Hawaii?**

They didn't swim to Hawaii because they were too lazy.

**Who didn't go to the gym every day last summer?**

George and Peter. They didn't go to the gym last

summer.

**Did George and Peter go to the beach every day last summer?**

No, no. They didn't go to the beach. They didn't go to the gym either.

**Last summer, George and Peter wanted to listen to their favorite English podcast. Finally, they didn't do that either. They were too lazy.**

**Did George listen to his favorite English podcast?**

No. He didn't. He didn't listen to his favorite English podcast.

**Why didn't he listen to his favorite English podcast?**

Because he was too lazy, he didn't listen to his favorite English podcast because he was too lazy.

**What didn't George do last summer?**

George didn't listen to his favorite English podcast.
